




One particularly intriguing location is "The Waiting Place." which presents a metaphor for those moments in life where we find ourselves in anticipation, unsure of what comes next.




The delightful illustrations and readaloud story will be a huge hit with all fans of the classic We're Going on a Bear Hunt.
