




#### MR ECCLES' TOP PICK...




## Author spotlight

He has also written about football, rugby and running, creating thrilling stories about the sport while still including friendships and adventure among the pages, too!




going today ... tell us how it should be done!

### KS1- Year 1 and 2



### LKS2- Year 3 and 4





#### UKS2- Year 5 and 6




